
COMMUNION *kneel*

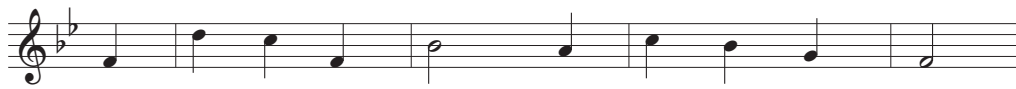

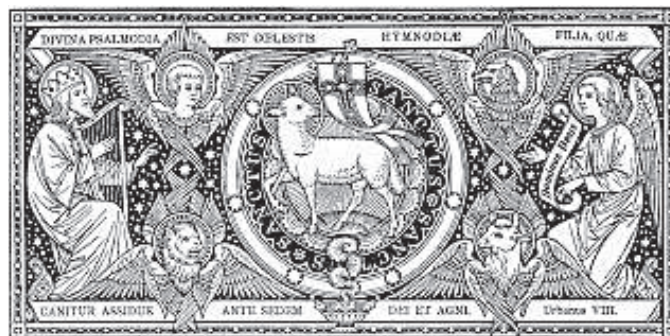

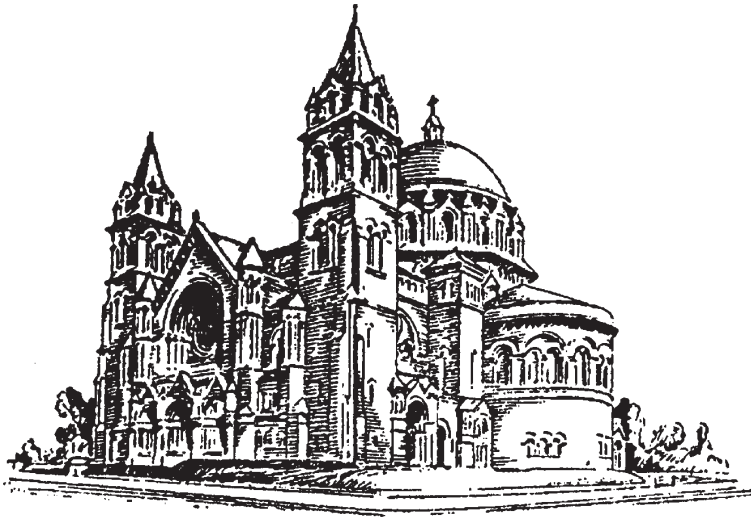
