# PENTECOST SUNDAY

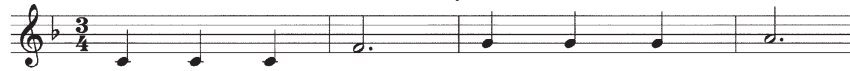

[Sunday] John 20:19-23**HOMILY****EVANGELIZATION COMMISSIONING CEREMONY** *following the homily, the Priest introduces the Commissioning:*

**Priest:** For the evangelization activity of the Church, the cooperation of a great many people is needed, so that communities as well as individuals may advance to full maturity in faith and continually show forth their faith. On this Solemnity of Pentecost, we are reminded that just as the Holy Spirit was poured forth upon Mary and the Apostles on that first Pentecost Sunday, the Holy Spirit was poured into our hearts at our baptism and His sevenfold gifts were sealed in our Confirmation. It is the power of the Holy Spirit which calls and enables each one of us to continue the mission of Jesus by bringing his love, mercy, and compassion to all those we encounter. Pope Francis has consistently challenged all Catholics to live the Joy of the Gospel. And now, let us call to mind the faith which we professed in our Baptism and renew our baptismal commitment to live as joyful missionary disciples. And so I ask you:

- Priest:** Do you renounce Satan?      **All:** I do.      **Priest:** And all his works?      **All:** I do.
- Priest:** And all his empty promises?      **All:** I do.
- Priest:** Do you reject sin, so as to live in the freedom of God's children?  
**All:** I do.
- Priest:** Do you reject the glamor of evil, and refuse to be mastered by evil?  
**All:** I do.
- Priest:** Do you reject Satan, father of sin and prince of darkness?  
**All:** I do.
- Priest:** Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth?  
**All:** I do.
- Priest:** Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered death and was buried, rose again from the dead and is seated at the right hand of the Father?  
**All:** I do.
- Priest:** Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?  
**All:** I do.
- Priest:** This is our faith. This is the faith of the Church. We are proud to profess it, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

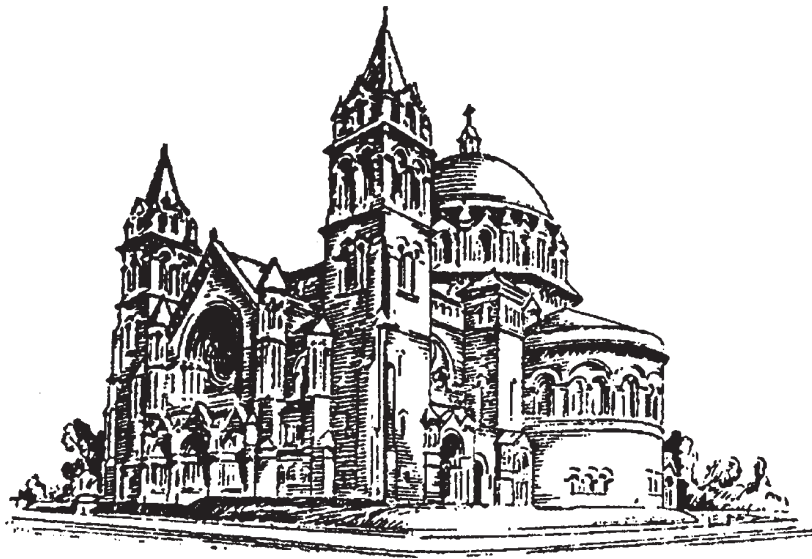
