HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH *stand*

All: I believe in one God, the Father almighty,

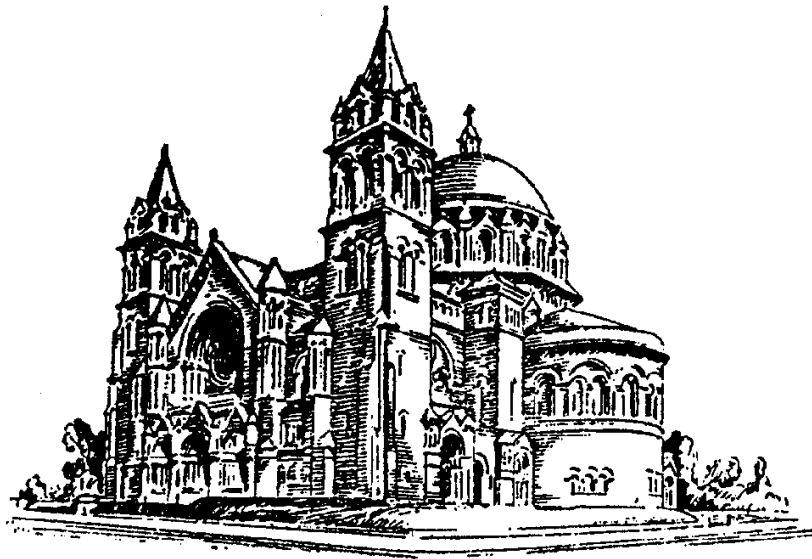
