PROFESSION OF FAITH *stand*

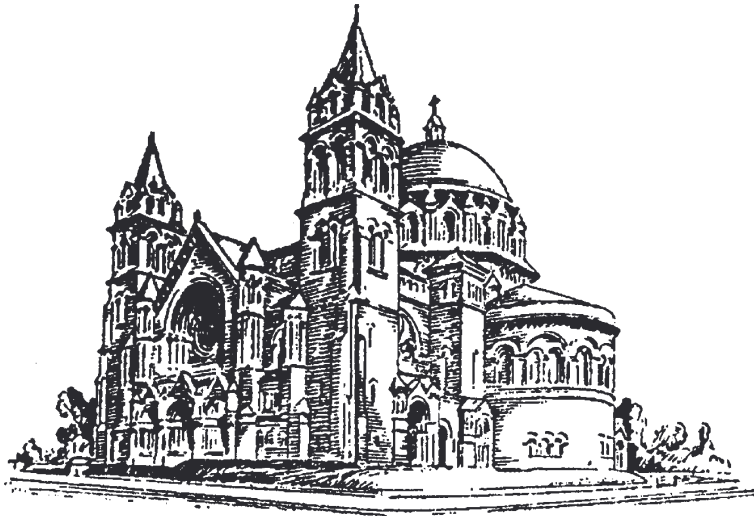
Saint Michael Prayer
