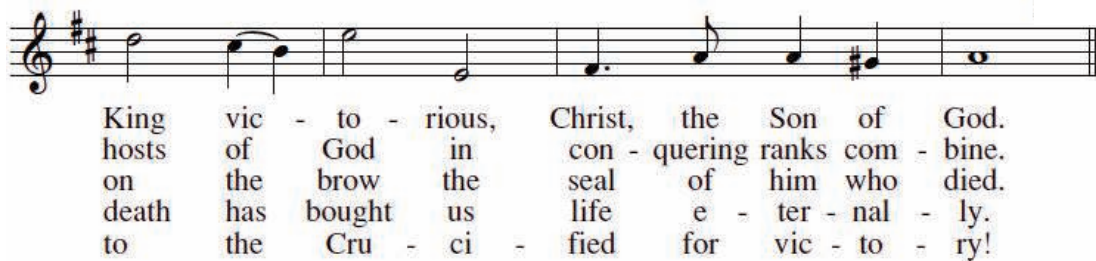
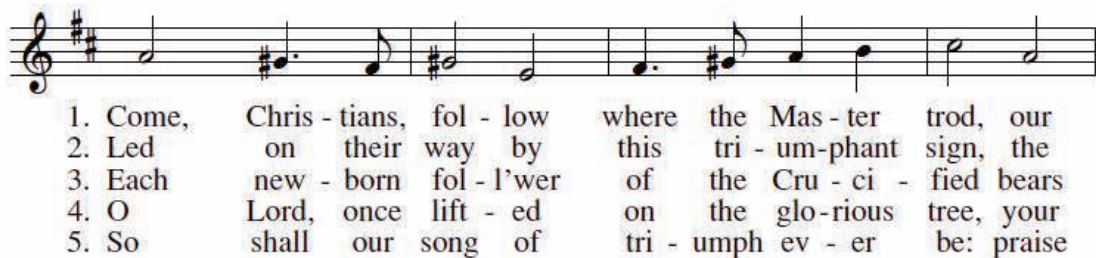
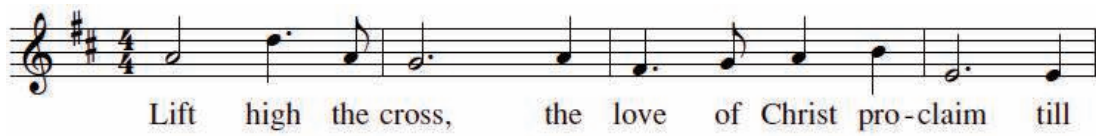

**PROFESSION OF FAITH** *stand*



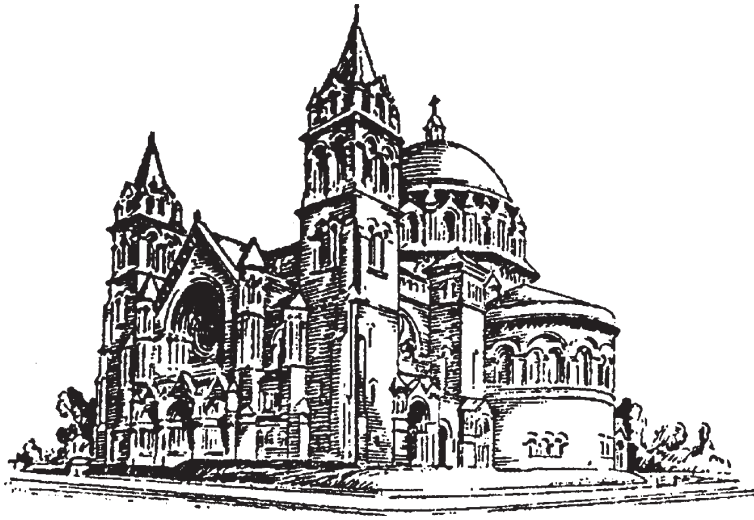
