FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Parishioners,

In the Acts of the Apostles, we hear of the crowds in Jerusalem who listened to Peter’s first sermon and were “cut to the heart.” This powerful moment is not just a scene from the early Church—it is a mirror held up to each of us. Whenever the Gospel is truly heard, it has the ability to pierce our hearts. It reveals the distance between who we are and who God calls us to be. It uncovers our indifference, our complacency, and our sin.

In a world that often encourages us to think highly of ourselves, the Gospel invites us into a deeper honesty. It helps us see our true selves—not to discourage us, but to awaken us. Like those first listeners, we begin to ask the essential question: “*What must we do?*”

Peter’s answer remains as clear and urgent today as it was then: “*Repent, and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.*” In other words, turn your heart back to God. Lift your gaze away from self-preoccupation and fix your eyes on Jesus—crucified and risen—who calls each of us to follow Him.

This call is beautifully echoed in the Gospel image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. He is not distant or indifferent. He knows His sheep intimately—He calls each one by name—and He leads them with care and purpose. The sheep recognize His voice because they listen, and in listening, they remain on the right path.

The same is true for us. When we listen daily to the Word of God, we grow in our ability to recognize the voice of Christ in our lives. Amid the many competing voices of our world—voices of fear, division, and distraction—the voice of the Shepherd remains steady and true. And Jesus assures us: we need not follow a stranger.

Even in the midst of uncertainty and suffering in our world—war, injustice, and hardship—the Risen Lord continues to call out to His people. He leads us forward, not backward. He gathers us as His flock and invites us to grow in love, to care for one another, and to remain close to Him.

The promise is profound: if we follow Him, we will not only find the right path—we will find life. As Jesus tells us, He has come so that we “may have life, and have it in abundance.” May we have the courage to let the Gospel pierce our hearts, the humility to turn back to the Lord, and the faith to follow the voice of the Good Shepherd wherever He leads.

ARCHBISHOP'S COLUMN

We Should Respond to Relativism with Humility and Fidelity

As disciples, we should hold fast to Jesus, who said ‘I am the way and the truth and the life’

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Our readings from the Acts of the Apostles this week mark three shifts in the early Church: the shift to the inclusion of the Gentiles, the shift from the missionary tasks of St. Peter to the missionary journeys of St. Paul, and the shift in what the disciples were called (“it was in Antioch that the disciples were first called Christians”). That can help us think about a shift we’re called to make in our own time.

One of the prominent features of St. John’s Gospel is the seven “I am” statements of Jesus. We encounter three of them this week: I am the light of the world (John 8:12); I am the good shepherd (John 10:11); I am the way and the truth and the life (John 14:6).

The “I am” statements in John are like a diamond: They have many facets and they’re tremendously valuable for us! One of those facets, and a dimension of discipleship they call forth for us, is a response to the pervasive relativism we encounter in contemporary culture.

Jesus didn’t say: ‘Go out and live your best life.’ He said: “Take up your cross and follow me.”

Jesus didn’t say ‘religions are different paths to one goal, choose the one that suits you.’ He said: “No one comes to the Father except through me.”

Jesus didn’t say: ‘Everyone has to speak their own truth.’ He said: “I am the way and the truth and the life.”

Contemporary relativism often masks itself as humility. “Well, I can’t claim to know everything. So, I’ll just speak my truth.” The humility there is

partially true! The problem is that it’s used as an on-ramp for something that’s false: the claim that there is no truth, or that we can’t know the truth.

How should a disciple respond to relativism? Not by abandoning humility in favor of hubris! Instead, we need to hold fast both to humility (because I don’t know everything) and to fidelity (because Jesus does).

This week we hear the Holy Spirit say: “Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.” That’s the beginning of St. Paul’s first missionary journey. We, too, have a missionary journey to make — within our own culture!

This week we celebrate the feast of St. Joseph the Worker (May 1). We, too, have work to do!

This week we hear St. Thomas lament: “Master, we do not know where you are going, how can we know the way?” Jesus’ response blazes the path of humility and fidelity: Thomas, you’re right about this — you don’t know everything about where I’m going. But you know me, and that’s enough. If you stay on the path with me, I’ll get you to the destination.

We can and should be humble, because we don’t know everything! At the same time we can and should reject relativism because we know Jesus, and He is the way and the truth and the life.

Eucharistic Exposition

The Blessed Sacrament, the very presence of Christ's body and blood in the Eucharist, is reserved in the tabernacle of the Blessed Sacrament Chapel to the east of the main sanctuary. At all hours the Cathedral is open, people may be found praying there before the Lord "face to face." **Each Saturday afternoon, beginning at 3:30 p.m., the Eucharist is displayed for prayer and adoration in public exposition in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel for a holy hour.** Following this holy hour, the Evening Prayer of the Church with Benediction is celebrated.

Additionally, the Blessed Sacrament is displayed for public adoration and prayer on the First Friday of the month. First Friday Adoration begins at approximately 8:30 a.m., following the completion of the 8:00 a.m. Mass, and concludes with Benediction at 11:45 a.m. Our next First Friday Adoration will be held **Friday, May 1.**

Why A Registered Parishioner

Due to the number of requests for baptisms and weddings, the Cathedral Parish adopted a policy years ago that generally requires parents to be registered parishioners of the parish before their infant may be baptized here, or for an engaged person to be a registered parishioner and practicing Catholic for a minimum of one year for preferred dates and for a more modest stipend. Non-parishioners must be registered in a Catholic parish somewhere and will need to secure their pastor's permission to be baptized or married outside of their proper parish before we can schedule any ceremony. 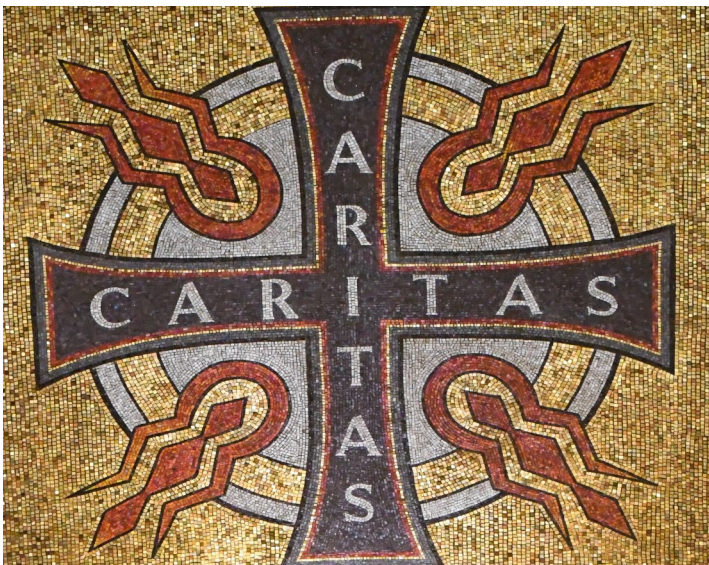
