FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Parishioners,

This Saturday, August 15, the Church celebrates one of the most important feasts of the Liturgical Year dedicated to Mary Most Holy: the Assumption. At the end of her earthly life Mary was taken up, body and soul, into Heaven, that is, into the glory of eternal life, into full and perfect communion with God. Thus, in contemplating the Virgin Mary, we are granted the grace and the ability to see our own life in depth also.



Pope Pius XII interpreted the deep theological meaning of this mystery on 1 November 1950 when he pronounced the solemn Dogmatic Definition of this Marian privilege.

He declared: "Hence, the revered Mother of God, from all eternity joined in a hidden way with Jesus Christ in one and the same decree of predestination, immaculate in her conception, a most perfect virgin in her divine motherhood, the noble associate of the divine Redeemer who has won a complete triumph over sin and its consequences, finally obtained, as the supreme culmination of her privileges, that she should be preserved free from the corruption of the tomb and that, like her own Son, having overcome death, she might be taken up body and soul to the glory of Heaven where, as Queen, she sits in splendour at the right hand of her Son, the immortal King of the Ages" (Apostolic Constitution *Munificentissimus Deus*: AAS 42, [1 November 1950]).

With its problems and hopes, our daily existence receives light from the Mother of God, from her spiritual journey, from her destiny of glory. Through her life of discipleship, she teaches us how to become a more perfect follower of Christ and reminds us of our eternal reward through this feast. Let us imitate her now in her meek following Christ and her generous service to all.

This year the Solemnity is not a Holy Day of Obligation Mass the Feast Day will be observed at the 8am Saturday morning Mass.

ARCHBISHOP'S COLUMN

Let Jesus Enter Into Our Earthly Lives So We Can Enter Into His Heavenly Life

Letting Jesus' power enter into us means experiencing His love, joy and peace but also His sacrifice.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The readings for these early Aug. weeks begin with Peter walking on the water, and end with the feast of the Assumption (Aug. 15). There's a lesson in that trajectory with salvific significance for us.

When Peter walks on water (see Matthew 14), power goes forth from Jesus and enters into him, enabling him to do what he could not do on his own.

Immediately after that, people are clamoring to touch the tassel on Jesus' cloak — and as many as touch it are healed. Again, power is going forth from Jesus and entering into others.

On Aug. 5th we celebrate the feast of St. Mary Major — the oldest Church in the West dedicated to Mary. Behind that dedication is the Council of Ephesus (431 AD) which declared that, because Jesus is God, and because Mary gave birth to Jesus, it is fitting to call Mary the "Mother of God."

Why does this matter? Because it's the same lesson, cast into a physical form: The power of Jesus doesn't remain self-contained, but enters into another person — in this case, Mary. This was the very purpose of Jesus coming to earth: so that His power wouldn't simply remain in heaven, but would enter into our world — and enter, ultimately, into us.

What we celebrate on the Feast of the Transfiguration (Aug. 6) is this same reality: Power goes forth from Jesus — not for His own sake, but for the sake of the faith of the apostles who witnessed the event.

And where, in the end, does all of this lead? That's where the Feast of the Assumption comes in. Mary, in the most radical way, allowed the power of Jesus to

enter into her. Then, at the end of her life, she was drawn after Him: She was assumed, body and soul, into heaven.

So, what will happen to us if we allow Jesus to enter into our souls in prayer, into our bodies in the sacraments and into our schedules in discipleship? That's the point: Mary's assumption is a pledge of what Jesus wants to do with each of us at the end of time.

Is it really possible? Well, we celebrate the feast days of St. John Vianney (Aug. 4) and St. Lawrence (Aug. 10) and St. Maximilian Kolbe (Aug. 14) these weeks: three men who let Jesus enter into their earthly lives, and so they entered into His heavenly life. We celebrate the feast days of St. Clare (Aug. 11) and St. Jane Frances De Chantal (Aug. 12): two women who let Jesus enter into their earthly lives, and so they entered into His heavenly life.

Ah, but do we want it?

If we let the power of Jesus enter into us, then we'll experience His love, His joy, His peace. And that's marvelous — everyone seems to want that! But letting the power of Jesus enter into us requires allowing His obedience and His sacrifice to enter into us, too. That can hurt — and so people draw away from that.

When Peter let the power of Jesus enter into him, he could walk on water. When he forgot to surrender himself to that power, he sank. The same choice is offered to us. These first two weeks of Aug., which will it be?

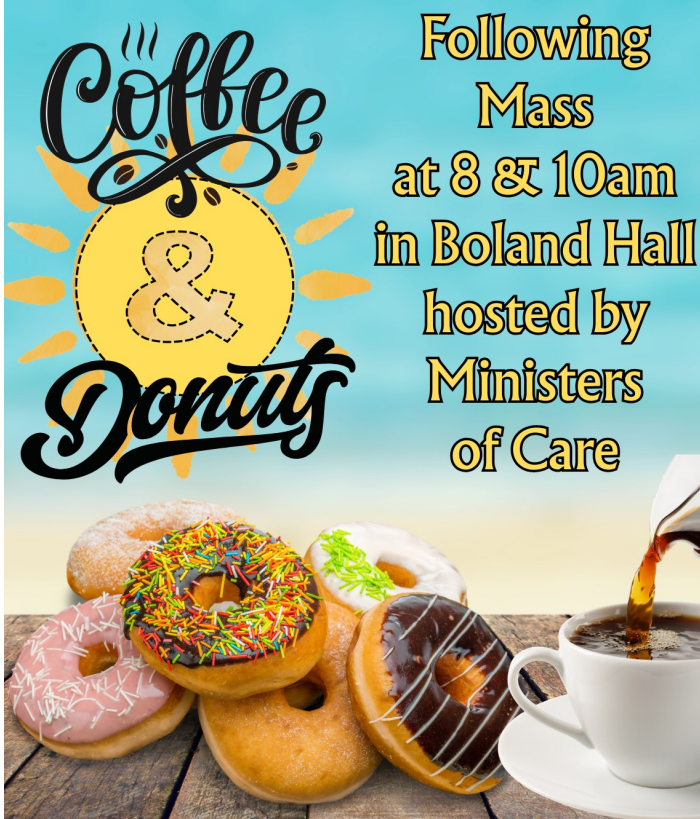
