FROM OUR RECTOR

PASTORAL STAFF

Dear Parishioners,

We find ourselves amid a fearful challenge that I believe speaks to our hearts and questions where our hearts are. The challenge is to the inviolable dignity of innocent human life in our beloved State of Missouri. Amendment 3 seeks a constitutional guarantee of the right to "enshrine the right to abortion at any time of pregnancy" with no protection to the preborn child, even when the child is capable of feeling pain.

Additionally, it will prohibit any regulation of abortion, including regulations designed to protect women undergoing abortions, and prohibit any civil or criminal recourse against anyone who performs an abortion and hurts or kills the pregnant woman.

I invite you to a special informational session to discuss Missouri Amendment 3 and its potential impacts on our community. This is an important opportunity to gain insights and engage in meaningful conversation about this legislation. Mary Catherine Martin, senior counsel of the Thomas More Society, will join us on Sunday, October 20, following the 10 am Mass during Coffee and Donuts in the Boland Hall Cafeteria.

Don't forget about our All Souls Novena. You are invited to send us the names of the deceased loved ones you wish included in the Novena, and they will be remembered collectively in a Mass each day for nine days. In addition to our prayer, the name and image of your loved one will be displayed in our chapel, and you will receive a Mass card with the name of your departed loved one inscribed inside. Jesus invites us in the Gospel this week to put God before everything, even before our possessions, and consider the poor as our brothers and sisters to whom we are in debt of love and help. It may seem that the Lord is asking us to give something up, and he is, partly. But what the Lord is asking is, in fact, a great wisdom of life. Jesus' answer to the question Peter asks in the name of the disciples explains the consequences of this evangelical wisdom. Those who leave everything to follow Jesus receive a hundred times as much during their life and will receive eternal life after their death. Sometimes we think that Gospel life is only deprivation. The rich man thought like this. Actually, following Jesus is extremely "convenient," not just for the future salvation of our souls, but also to enjoy a hundred times as much life on this earth.

ARCHBISHOP'S COLUMN

Extending the Love of Christ to Those in Every Corner of the World

By supporting World Mission Sunday, Catholics contribute to the Church's global outreach

As we prepare to celebrate World Mission Sunday on Oct. 20, we are reminded of the rich missionary history that continues to shape the Church today. The call to bring the Gospel to all nations, especially to places where the Church is still young, poor or suffering persecution, is at the heart of our faith. This mission is not only global but also deeply connected to the story of the Catholic Church in St. Louis and the United States.

World Mission Sunday, established by Pope Pius XI in 1926, invites Catholics worldwide to support mission territories that rely on our prayers and financial generosity. Inspired by Blessed Pauline Jaricot, who encouraged Catholics to contribute even the smallest amounts — a penny a week — to support the missions, this collection has helped to build the Church in every corner of the world. Her vision, rooted in both prayer and action, reminds us that even the smallest coin can make a lasting impact on the future of the Church.

Here in St. Louis, we are heirs to a legacy of missionary work that began in the early days of our diocese. Once referred to as the "Rome of the West," we were a mission territory in the 19th century. French missionary priests like Bishop Louis William Valentine DuBourg and Bishop Peter Richard Kenrick were pivotal in establishing the Catholic Church here, bringing the Gospel to the growing population of immigrants and Native Americans. St. Louis became a spiritual hub for the Church's growth in the Midwest, and this missionary spirit continues to thrive today.

The missionary history of St. Louis is intertwined with our namesake, St. Louis IX, the great French king known for his love of the poor and dedication to the works of mercy. His legacy serves as a constant reminder of the Church's call to care for the most vulnerable and to spread the Gospel with humility and compassion. St. Louis embodied the spirit of inviting everyone to the banquet of God's love, a call that Pope Francis echoes in this year's World Mission Sunday theme: "Go and invite everyone to the banquet."

The World Mission Sunday Collection supports missionaries who are serving in over 1,100 dioceses across Asia, Africa, Oceania and Latin America. These missionaries are on the frontlines of evangelization, working in places where the Church is still being built — physically and spiritually. Their work involves more than just preaching the Gospel; it includes providing education, health care and pastoral care to communities that are often marginalized or in need. As St. Louis once received help from others to grow, we are now called to give back, extending the same invitation to those who are hearing the Gospel for the first time.

Since its inception, the Pontifical Mission Societies have played a crucial role in fostering the Church's global outreach. The Society for the Propagation of the Faith, founded by Blessed Pauline Jaricot in 1822, is one of the four Pontifical Mission Societies that coordinate this mission work.

When you give to the World Mission Sunday Collection, you are sharing the love of Christ with those who need it most. Your contributions help build churches, train seminarians and provide for the spiritual and material needs of communities in mission territories. In this way, you are directly participating in the mission of the Church, offering an invitation to the banquet of God's love.

I invite you to prayerfully consider how you can support this vital work. As Pope Francis reminds us, the Church's mission is universal, and we are all called to be a part of it. Let us continue to respond generously, extending the love of Christ to those in every corner of the world.

May God bless you abundantly for your missionary spirit and your generosity.



About the Instructor Fr. Peter Fonseca was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of St. Louis in 2015. He holds a Master of Arts in Theology and a Master of Divinity from Kenrick-Glennon Seminary. Additionally, he holds a Master of Science in Bioethics from the University of Mary, where he was chosen by the faculty as the distinguished graduate student, and a certification in Catholic Healthcare Ethics from the National Catholic Bioethics Center.

Having previously served as a pastor, Fr. Fonseca is now assigned as the Director of Continuing Formation for Priests for the Archdiocese of St. Louis while pursuing doctoral studies in health care ethics at St. Louis University. While studying at SLU, he has taught in the undergraduate program and served as a research fellow for the Catholic Health Association. In addition to his canonical assignments, he serves as a consultor to various parties in the Archdiocese of St. Louis and the greater St. Louis area on bioethical issues. Fr. Fonseca has presented at various conferences and seminars across the country and has contributed to local television and national radio programs.
