## Dear Parishioners,

All Saints day is just around the corner. To celebrate this great feast, we will have the relics of the Cathedral on display for adoration in prayer in the All Saints Chapel. After each Mass on All Saints Day, we will chant the Litany of Saints and process to the All Saints Chapel for a special prayer. This feast is an excellent opportunity for us as the pilgrim church to call to mind the many men and women who have already reached heaven, and through them, we are invigorated to walk to the path of holiness here on earth

The day following All Saints, we remember our deceased relatives and friends. If you have a loved one that you would have remembered in our All Souls Novena, there is still time to do so. Just visit cathedralstl.org/all -souls to submit your name(s). During the length of the Novena, the names and photos of loved ones will be placed in the All Souls Chapel for prayer and devotion.

On the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of each month, Cardinal Glennon would celebrate Mass and give the sermon during his time as the Archbishop of St. Louis. The following is from the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of November 1919. "The church kindly leads us by the hand during these days, asks us to kneel by the graves of our friends and to pray to Him that they may rest in peace and to ask Christ, who is all-powerful and merciful, to forgive them their sins and to bring them to his own place of rest and joy, that they may all join in the grand processional of saints, chanting benediction, praise and worship, honor and glory, to him who sitteth on the throne.

Looked at in this way, death is not a tragedy. It stands merely as a temporary loss to which greater gains succeed. The Christian's hope therein is secure, for it is based upon the work and the word of one who cannot deceive, and who will not betray, Christ who died for us and in dying conquered death.

For all our dear departed, we must pray. We would be ungrateful and forgetful-our friendship and our faith would be equally empty if we did not remember these, our friends—if we did not remember the cry to us 'have pity on me—have pity on me...Pray to the Almighty to speedily bring these, his children, home to bless them with his presence and to crown them with bliss forever."

# Find the Light in the Midst of the Darkness

Hope is the conviction that God is in charge, even in the darkest hours

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

We turn from October to November this week. With sunrise getting later and sunset getting earlier, we start to feel the darkness more intensely. The same might be said of our sense of culture right before an election: We feel the darkness more intensely.

It raises the question for me: Where are you finding hope these days? Hope is, after all, a kind of light in the midst of darkness.

But before you answer that question, let's make an important distinction: I'm talking about hope, not optimism.

Optimism is the conviction that "things will get better." I don't think anyone needs to believe that. History tells us, and the cross shows us, that things often get worse. Christian faith has plenty of room for that kind of realism.

Hope, by contrast, is the conviction that "God is in charge." Faith tells us, and the cross shows us, that even in the darkest hour God is still in charge. It's important when things seem dark to make time and energy and space for those people, places and events that keep our sense of hope alive and strong.

Fortunately, that's exactly what this week is about. If culture has made Halloween something of a celebration of darkness, for us it remains All Hallows' Eve — the eve of All Saints Day. The light of the saints predominates our sense of this week, and the light of the saints is precisely Jesus Christ, the source of our hope.

Halloween is one of the great feasts of children in our culture. That makes it a good time to recall the words

of Jesus: "Unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 18:3). How does a child receive the kingdom? Let me propose three key elements of a child's receptivity for our imitation.

First: acceptance. When told there is a heaven, the child says, "OK!" Likewise, simple and deep acceptance of spiritual realities is important for our life of faith. We just need to combine childlike acceptance with an adult's awareness that the spiritual realities are both good and bad: Angels are real; so are devils.

Second: wonder and awe. When told about spiritual realities, the child says, "Wow!" What we can see with our eyes is not all there is, and that's wonderful! We know that in one way through the sciences; we can know it in another way through faith.

Third: curiosity. When told about spiritual realities, the child will combine acceptance with curiosity, and ask, "OK, how, exactly, does that work?" To have acceptance without curiosity is to be childish rather than childlike, but curiosity without acceptance tends toward cynicism.

This week we celebrate all the saints who brought the light of Christ into the darkness of their time. As we do so, let's ponder how the light of Jesus can shine in us and through us. Then we can be witnesses to hope — and therefore sources of light in the darkness of our own times.

About the Instructor Fr. Peter Fonseca was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of St. Louis in 2015. He holds a Master of Arts in Theology and a Master of Divinity from Kenrick-Glennon Seminary. Additionally, he holds a Master of Science in Bioethics from the University of Mary, where he was chosen by the faculty as the distinguished graduate student, and a certification in Catholic Healthcare Ethics from the National Catholic Bioethics Center.

Having previously served as a pastor, Fr. Fonseca is now assigned as the Director of Continuing Formation for Priests for the Archdiocese of St. Louis while pursuing doctoral studies in health care ethics at St. Louis University. While studying at SLU, he has taught in the undergraduate program and served as a research fellow for the Catholic Health Association. In addition to his canonical assignments, he serves as a consultor to various parties in the Archdiocese of St. Louis and the greater St. Louis area on bioethical issues. Fr. Fonseca has presented at various conferences and seminars across the country and has contributed to local television and national radio programs.
