FINANCIAL ANALYSIS AND OUTLOOK

Dear Parishioners,

I am pleased to share with you the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis Parish's 2019-2020 Annual Financial Report. Through the efforts of the parish's staff, Finance Committee and Parish Council, we seek to be responsible stewards of the financial resources that our parish commits to the work of our ministries and care and maintenance of our parish facilities.

Most importantly I would like to express my gratitude to every parishioner, because without everyone working together, we cannot be a strong vibrant parish. Thank you for your strong support of the parish's mission.

Year-on-year, our financial results are encouraging in that, despite a lack of major gifts and a modest decline in the Offertory Collection, our revenues were greater than expenses. We continue to see increases in online giving, as expected from our younger and more tech-savvy parishioners.

That said, these results come in substantial part from careful management of expenses rather than a true income surplus. In addition, looking ahead we see a need for major capital expenditures to maintain our aging physical facility and keep it technologically current. We were relatively well prepared, for example, to livestream our Masses and other liturgical events and even inaugurate a weekday organ concert series, all in the pandemic environment, but we foresee a need to be able to do more and better.

I would like to highlight two specific projects that the Cathedral will need to address in the not-so-distant future: the roof and façade of the Cathedral. Recently, we completed a full study of the exterior of the Cathedral and have discovered many areas that will need to be addressed. While we are still compiling the numbers, the cost of this will be much more than what our regular offertory will be able to cover.

Thank you for your continued generosity. As we move forward during this pandemic and seek to address some long-term maintenance needs, your gift to the parish will become ever more necessary.

Finance Council Overview

The Finance Council would like to thank our parishioners, ministries and organizations for the generous contributions that supported the parish this fiscal year ending June 30, 2020. We are extremely grateful for your support and consider it a privilege to serve the parish and work with the generous, dynamic and amazing people throughout the year.

Finance Council members meet with the Pastor to develop the parish budget and continually monitor the financial health of the parish with detailed reviews of revenues and expenses. Financial reporting and cash management is a comprehensive process to ensure the financial viability of the parish.

Here are some highlights from the Fiscal year ending June 30, 2020.

- Expenses remained roughly the same.
- Total Revenue decreased by \$580,279, mostly because we had received a large bequest in 2019
- The General Offertory collection decreased by \$58,000
- The Annual Cathedral Basilica Gala raised \$294,608
- A Parish Endowment Fund was established at the Roman Catholic Foundation with \$100,000 from a previous large bequest to the parish.



FINANCIAL TERMS EXPLAINED

Income

Offertory Collection: Unrestricted gifts from weekly envelopes, loose cash and on-line giving

Unrestricted Gifts: Bequests and Year End Gifts; other unrestricted gifts not received in the Offertory Collection

Restricted Donations: Gifts and bequests identified for a specific Parish or Archdiocesan purpose (e.g., Flowers, Landscaping, Catholic Education, Retired Priests and Religious Fund)

Program Fees: Fees associated with Parish programs or ministries (e.g., votive offerings, weddings) Investment Income: Interest paid on Parish deposits with the St. Louis Archdiocesan Fund and other depositor fund accounts

Grant Revenue: Grants from the Annual Catholic Appeal for operational expenses; Risk Management; and the Archbishop's Fund

Other Revenue: Rental income from Boland Hall, the Cathedral Convent and Cathedral Concerts

Expense

Personnel Expenses: Parish salaries, payroll taxes and benefits (e.g., health insurance, retirement, and disability insurance)

Supplies Purchased: Supplies used in parish liturgies and ministries (e.g., collection envelopes, missalettes, votive candles, cleaning and janitorial supplies)

Fees and Services: Costs associated with individual or professional services (e.g., wedding coordinators, cantors, music section leaders)

Occupancy: Building related services (e.g., security guards, IT service, repair and maintenance services, utilities)

Transfer Parishes/Diocese: Parish payments to the Archdiocese (e.g., Cathedraticum, insurance, St Louis Review, Shared Accounting, Payroll Service)

Other Non-Cash Transactions: Non-monetary transactions; depreciation, amortization & depletion

Capital Expenditures: Building component upgrades and replacements (e.g., HVAC systems, plumbing, lighting, IT equipment)

Beyond Sunday Update

The total goal for the Beyond Sunday Campaign for the Cathedral Basilica Parish was \$765,000, with 60% of the amount raised committed to the Beyond Sunday Education Fund for scholarships to Catholic schools. Original plans for the Beyond Sunday funds returned to the Cathedral Parish included enhancement of the Cathedral security system and user-friendliness upgrades to Boland Hall. Since then, the security system has been paid for by the Archdiocese instead of the Parish. The Archdiocese has also suggested a major repurposing of Cathedral School/Boland Hall space that would include the planned upgrades, so that project was put on hold. The Beyond Sunday funds have not been spent and are being held in our account until the Parish Council and Finance Council develop new plans for the use of those funds in the best interest of the Cathedral Parish. As of November 2020, the total amount raised for use of the parish is \$242,512 and anticipate receiving another \$40,000 when all pledge payments are paid.

To date, the campaign has provided:

\$3.1MM in Transformation and Academic Capacity Enhancement grants to Archdiocesan schools

\$8.6MM in Beyond Sunday Scholarships to 1939 students since 2016

\$33.2MM in endowment fund to support future Beyond Sunday scholarships

ARCHBISHOP'S COLUMN

Let God's plan unfold in your life

Appreciating the mystery of God requires a patience that goes with His sense of time

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

What's your attitude toward mystery?

Natural scientists aren't frustrated by what they don't know, nor dismissive toward what they don't fully understand. Instead, they're intrigued by it and determined to probe deeper. They lean into the mysteries of the natural world with a beautiful combination of childlike wonder and adult intellect. Perhaps we could learn something from them about how to approach the mysteries of the faith.

Now, the mysteries of faith are not exactly the same as the mysteries of nature. They aren't simply unknown; they pertain to the relationship between the infinite God and the finite world. But that just means we should lean into them with even more childlike wonder and adult intellect!

Think of the disciples of John the Baptist, who approached Jesus and asked: "Are you the one who is to come, or have we got to look for someone else?" Jesus didn't simply give them the answer. He told them to think about what they had heard and seen for themselves. "Go back and tell John what you have heard and seen..." Jesus invited them to lean into the mystery of His identity with their own observation and understanding.

That's been God's approach to humanity all through salvation history. God's own life is an infinite mystery. That doesn't mean it's something we can never know — it means that it's something we can never stop exploring. God has been revealing the mystery of His life to us all through history and within each of our own lives. But He takes one step at a time; His goal is to draw us in, not to force us on.

One key aspect of God's way of revealing Himself concerns time. Think of it as music. Music happens when notes are played over time. If you take all the notes in a piece of music and play them all at once — well, it's no longer music. Appreciating the music requires having the patience to let it play out over time.

Something similar is true of the mystery of salvation — God sharing our life, and offering us a share in His life. God revealed that mystery over time, like a beautiful piece of music, and invites us more deeply into it over the course of our lives. Appreciating the mystery requires patience that goes with God's sense of time.

The Church calendar shifts gears on December 17th. It pulls us into a different sense of time, to help us with the final week of preparation for Christmas. The Gospel for December 17th is, not surprisingly, the genealogy of Jesus — which focuses on how God's plans are worked out through time.

Let's lean into that sense of time in these last days before Christmas. If we do nothing but celebrate Christmas this week, then we play that one note over and over — and risk missing out on the music God is playing for us. Let the days unfold this week. Let God's plan unfold in your life. The anticipation and sense of longing is part of what God offers us these days. If we stay with Him, with awe and wonder and patience and determination, there's no end to the things He wants to show us.

Weekly Thoughts on Giving

"Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." – 1 Thes 5:16 - 18

This scripture reading sums up Stewardship. "Rejoice always" means place your trust in God; He will provide all that you need. "Pray constantly" means prayer should be a running conversation with God throughout the whole day, every day. "Give thanks in all circumstances" means even in bad situations, thank God. Suffering a little bit helps build empathy for others in similar situations and shows our dependence on God.

Why A Registered Parishioner

Due to the number of requests for baptisms and weddings, the Cathedral Parish adopted a policy years ago that generally requires parents to be registered parishioners of the parish before their infant may be baptized here, or for an engaged person to be a registered parishioner and practicing Catholic for a minimum of one year for preferred dates and for a more modest stipend. Non-parishioners must be registered in a Catholic parish somewhere and will need to secure their pastor's permission to be baptized or married outside of their proper parish before we can schedule any ceremony.
