FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The Third Sunday of Advent is called *Gaudete Sunday*—"Rejoice." Even the Church's color shifts from purple to rose, reminding us that Christmas joy is drawing near. The Scriptures speak with hope: "*The desert shall rejoice and blossom*," Isaiah proclaims, and the Psalmist sings, "*Happy are those whose help is the God of Jacob*."

Yet today's Gospel places us not in a scene of celebration, but in a prison cell. There we meet John the Baptist, not as the fearless prophet, but as a suffering and doubting man. From his cell he sends the haunting question to Jesus: "Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?"

This is surprising. John had seen the Spirit descend upon Jesus. He had proclaimed Him boldly. And yet, in suffering, his certainty falters. His story moves from confidence to doubt, from clarity to unknowing. Still, Jesus does not scold him. Instead, He replies with compassion:

"Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, the poor have the good news proclaimed to them."

Jesus points not to a theory, but to God's quiet work unfolding through mercy, healing, and hope. Then He adds a challenging blessing: "Blessed is anyone who takes no offense at me."

John's suffering is not taken away. Justice does not arrive in time. His story ends in silence and death. This unsettles us—especially since we follow a Crucified Savior. We would prefer faith that feels resolved and suffering that ends quickly. But the Gospel is honest: sometimes the prison doors remain closed, and the questions remain.

And yet, this is where true Christian joy appears. Biblical joy is not sentimentality or denial. It is not the absence of pain. It is trust that God is still at work, even when our circumstances are hard. It is the belief that our stories do not end with suffering, but with God.

John once said of Jesus, "My joy is now complete." Perhaps his joy was not rooted in comfort, but in surrender—trusting God even when the path led through darkness. "Are you the one who is to come?" John asked in despair. Through his life and witness, his answer still resounds with hope:

Yes.

On this Gaudete Sunday, we rejoice not because everything is easy—but because God is faithful, and He is still coming.

Third Sunday of Advent

The Third Sunday of Advent, also known as Gaudete Sunday, is a time for rejoicing because Jesus's birth is near, and his presence is a source of lasting joy, not fleeting happiness.



- Rejoice: The season of Advent is called "Gaudete" or "Rejoice" Sunday, marking a pause in the penitential season to celebrate the nearing arrival of Jesus. It's a joy rooted in a living faith and a secure relationship with God, not dependent on external circumstances.
- Repentance and action: The readings for this Sunday often feature John the Baptist, who called people to repent and live justly. This is a reminder to turn away from actions that are not of God and to "act justly, love tenderly and walk humbly with God".
- Source of joy: True joy is a spiritual gift from God, not a temporary feeling derived from material possessions or worldly comforts. It is found in the knowledge that "God is with us" (Emmanuel).
- Signs of hope: The period of Advent is a time to look for and acknowledge the signs of God's presence in the world, both past and present. This can be as profound as seeing signs of God's work in the world or as simple as the love and support within a family.


