**FROM OUR RECTOR**

Dear Parishioners,

Last week our church gathered as a parish community to celebrate the Solemnity of the Birth of Our Lord. I would like to extend my profound gratitude to all those who helped in the planning of these liturgies. All of our Masses were full to capacity. A special word of thanks to those who assisted in the decorating of the Basilica and crib scene. All of these decorations helped to make our celebration of Christmas so special. With a church so large there are so many moving parts. Many thanks to our ushers and greeters for extending the warmest of welcomes and Christmas greetings to all.

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Nazareth. Today we hear in our Gospel of the first time that Jesus entered the Temple of the Lord. On the 40th day after his birth, his parents offered on his behalf a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons, (Lk 2:24) that is, the sacrifice offered by the poor. The anxiety that Mary and Joseph experienced about Jesus is the same as that of every parent who educates a child, introduces him or her to life and to understanding reality. Today, therefore, it is only right to say a special prayer to the Lord for all the families of the world. Looking to the Holy Family of Nazareth as examples, may parents be seriously concerned with the development and upbringing of their children so that they grow up to be responsible and honest citizens, never forgetting that faith is a precious gift to be nurtured in their children by their own example.

At the same time we must fervently pray that every child be welcomed as a gift of God and be supported by the love of both parents in order to increase, like the Lord Jesus, in wisdom and in stature.

The silence of Joseph, a just man, and the example of Mary, who kept all these things in her heart, usher us into the mystery of the Holy Family, full of faith and humanity. As we enter this New Year, may all Christian families strive to live in God's presence with the same love and the same joy as the family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph.

## Respect Life Memorial Mass

January 22 marks the 48th anniversary of the court decision that legalized abortion on demand throughout the entire nine months of pregnancy. **On Saturday, January 16 at 10:00 a.m.**, all are invited to the celebration of the Annual Roe V. Wade Memorial Mass and Prayer Vigil here at the Cathedral Basilica, to pray for the protection of all unborn children who are in danger of abortion; for wisdom, strength, and fortitude for their mothers and fathers; for the conversion of all those who participate in the abortion industry; and for parents, family members, and friend who have suffered as a result of an abortion experience, that they may find hope and healing. The offertory collection will benefit LifeLine Coalition, a group of social service agencies whose financial and emotional support help over 10,000 women in our community annually. The Mass will be followed by a Rosary procession to the Planned Parenthood facility on Forest Park Avenue. 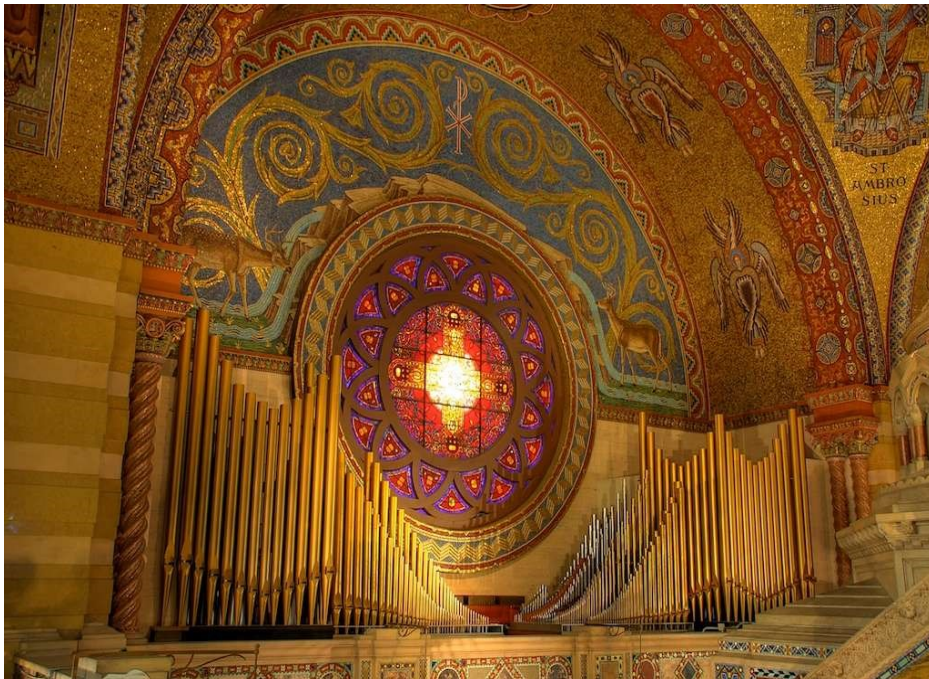
## Spiritual Leadership
