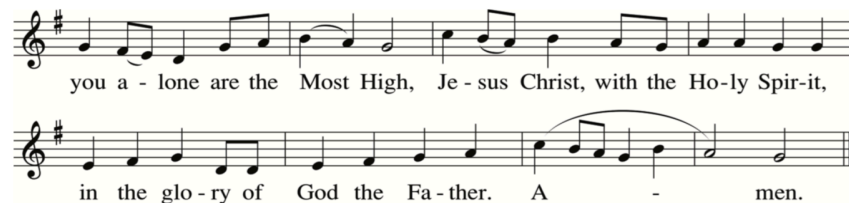

Profession of Faith

Communion

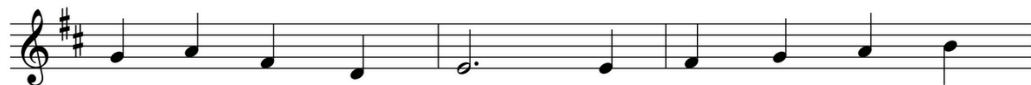
