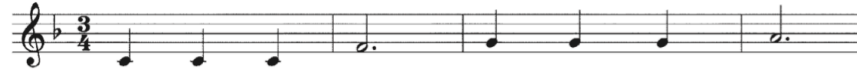
Pentecost Sunday

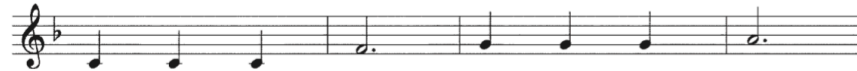

Communion
