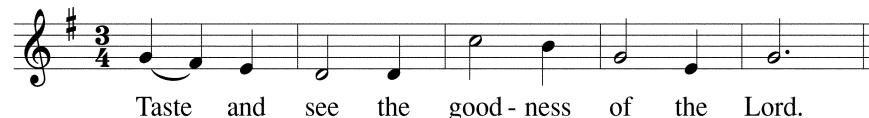
## Communion
