Homily

Profession of Faith

All: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. Communion
