



Communion

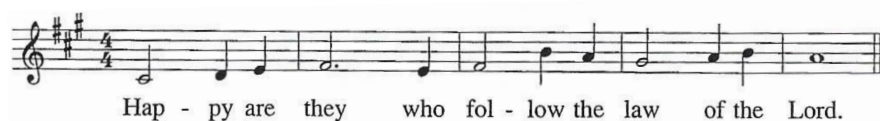
