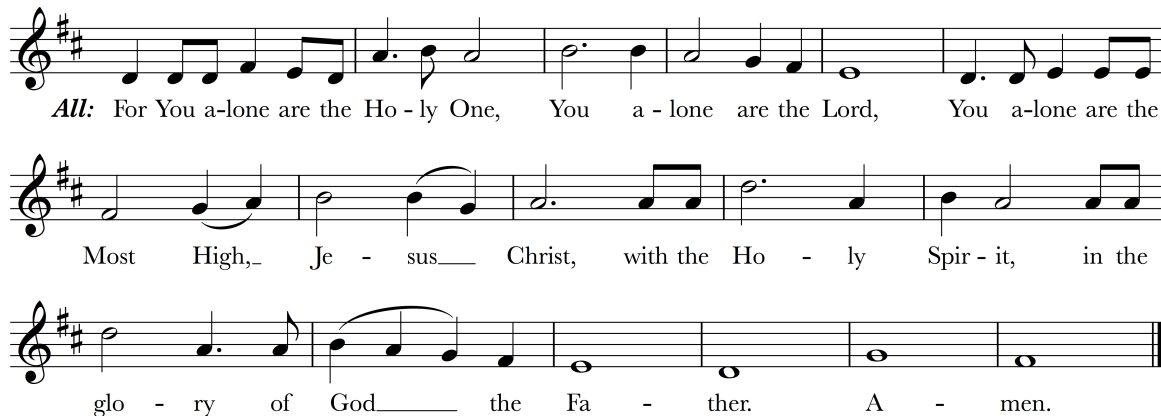

Profession of Faith

Communion
