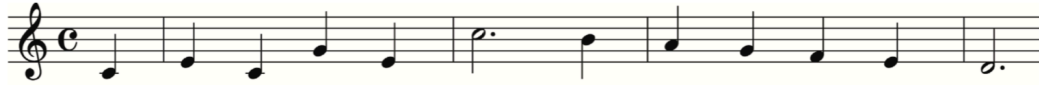
## Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

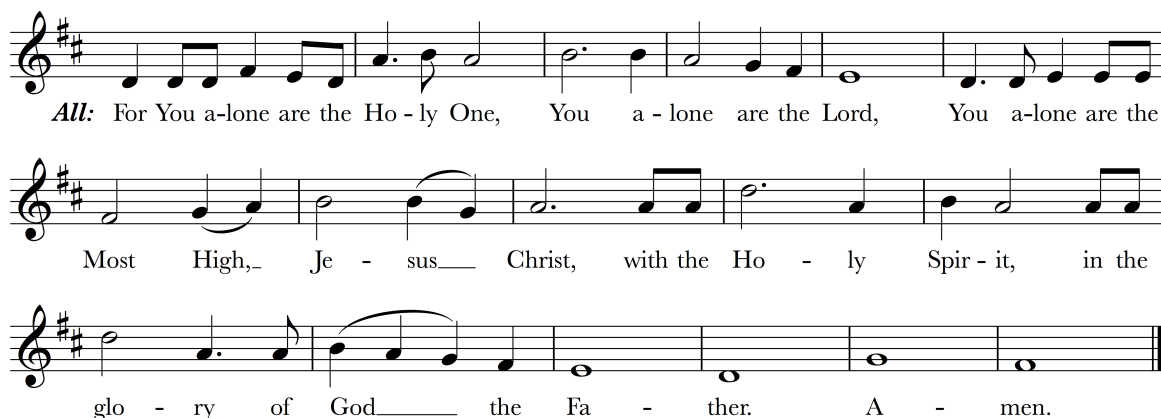

## Profession of Faith

*All:* I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.


## The Saint Michael Prayer
